2023 Annual Meeting – A First for the Friends and Foundation!

The inaugural meeting of the Pacific Grove Public Library Friends and Foundation (that's all of us!) was held, in person, at the Library on Sunday, January 29. The weather outside had been stormy, but inside was warmth and enjoyment of the beautiful, renewed library.

Nearly 40 attendees heard of the progress on Board goals, most notably the consolidation of the Friends and Foundation into one library support organization with a strengthened mission and shared purpose. The beautiful new logo was unveiled to the appreciative group; it was created by Juli

Hofmann, and combines aspects of the past Friends and Foundation logos while paying homage to the distinctive Carnegie library.

There was much to celebrate! Last year's Monterey County Gives! Campaign raised the highest total ever, ensuring funds for teen services and programs for almost a decade. Book sales, Dine Out and membership contributions provide solid support for annual Book Fund grants and immediate library needs. Generous major donors, such as the Laws family for local history, the Rock family for the children's room and the Russell family for the reading rotunda, ensure that these important services will be supported for many years.

Library Director Diana Godwin gave a wonderful presentation on the hugely popular children's services programs, return of poetry programs funded by the Poetry Fund, author events and the fall 2022 juried art show, "Renaissance: Remember, Rise and Revitalize", a fine art exhibition celebrating the Harlem Renaissance. Her enthusiasm and stories of the library's impact on the community brought the meeting to a rousing end.

A lucky door prize winner was announced, taking home a gift certificate from loyal Dine Out participant Max's Grill and a basket of literary goodies.

We are already thinking ahead to next year's Annual Meeting in January 2024 – we hope to see you there!

DINE OUT for the Library – Happily, the Friends and Foundation's popular Dine Out events have returned to the 'menu' of great things to do in PG! *La Mia Cucina and Max's Grill were featured in February and March*, and other participating restaurants coming up include:

Each restaurant very generously donates a portion of the proceeds for the day or evening directly to the Friends and Foundation (and through us, to the Library). All the diners have to do is enjoy some great fare and mention the Library and voila!

Dine Out was the inspiration of the then-Friends group president, Susan Steele, in 2014. Susan designed the logo still in use nearly a decade later. The program nets the library about \$3-4,000 annually, which helps support the library in so many ways. Dine Out is a win-win-win for the library, the restaurants, and hungry Pagrovians looking for a great meal!

The lush green hillsides and fields of wildflowers are brilliant evidence of the earth’s renewal this spring!

The Library continues its mission to bring cultural enrichment programs to our community. Get out your calendars and fill in the remaining spring presentations. Books will be available for purchase and signing at each event.

Monterey-based **AVA HOMA** is the national award-winning author of *Daughters of Smoke and Fire*, a journalist, and an activist. Her novel, an “unforgettable, haunting story of a young woman’s perilous fight for freedom and justice for her brother” is the first novel published in English by a female Kurdish writer. She will read from, and discuss her work at the library on Thursday, April 20, 7-8:30 PM.

Ms. Homa’s appearance marks the return of our Meet the Author events, absent these past three years.

DANIEL B. SUMMERHILL is a poet, performer and CSUMB assistant professor of poetry/social action and composition, who was selected as the inaugural poet laureate for Monterey County. He will make a return appearance to the library, along with

PILAR CHRISTIANA GRAHAM, who received her MFA in Poetry from CSU Fresno and teaches at CSU Monterey Bay and Fresno City College.

Both poets will read together on Friday, April 28, from 5:30-7 PM. Free.

California Poet Laureate **LEE HERRICK** is the first Asian American poet to serve in that role. He writes eloquently of life as an immigrant, adopted as a child and raised in the Central Valley. He now teaches at Fresno City College and the MFA program at the University of Nevada. His work is described as “Whitmanesque” and reflective of our diverse communities. **Herrick** will share a poetry reading on Friday, May 5, 5:30-7 PM. Free.

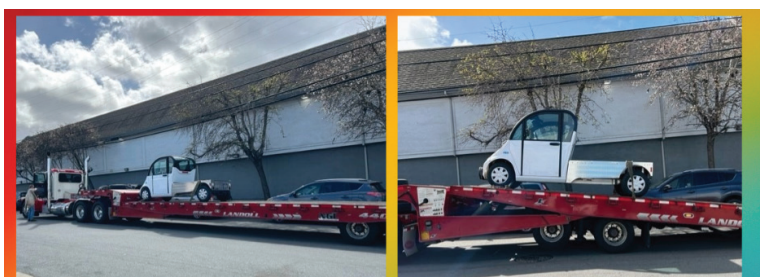
The Friends and Foundation are pleased to help sponsor these library programs, along with the Whitney Lathan-Lechich Trust and the Meet the Author Committee.

Update on MOVE (Mobile Outreach Vehicle, electric) *The roll out is coming ...*

The Library’s new, electrically-powered mobile outreach vehicle is currently parked at the Public Works lot awaiting metal fabrication by Arc Metal of Monterey. Fabrication involves the addition of shelving and other structural enhancements that will transform the vehicle pictured here into a mobile library ready to visit and serve Pacific Grove neighborhoods, schools, and community centers. Following fabrication, Signworks of Sand City will complete the wrap—the design, signage, logos and other vehicle graphics that will identify MOVE as our PG Library on wheels. Library Director Diana Godwin said in early April that she estimates three months before fabrication is complete and the vehicle is ready for the wrap.

MOVE was the focus of the Friends’ 2021 MC Gives! Campaign. Your generous donations and the MC Gives! matching funds contributed almost \$41,000 toward the purchase of the vehicle. The Library then applied for and was awarded a CA State Libraries “Improving Library Access” grant for the balance of funds needed to purchase the vehicle and complete the project.

Many thanks to all the donors, the Library staff and the City for working together on this very exciting project!

The Book Store in the Grove

It seems the Friends and Foundation's book shop at St. Mary's Church is no longer Pacific Grove's best-kept secret... This treasure trove of books, CDs, DVDs, puzzles, and children's material has been discovered!

Besides the local crowd of "regulars", devoted customers come from as far away as Moss Landing and Big Sur to peruse the diverse inventory and pop a few goodies into their bags. Volunteers, under the able guidance of Judy Wills and Lori Rolander, staff the shop Monday-Friday, from 10AM-noon, then again on the first Saturday of every month from 10AM-4PM.

Our varied selection is fueled by donations from community members, and our staff of volunteers gives every donation the once-over to ensure each item is in good shape. Specialty items include, among many others, vintage books, verified by volunteer Tom Post, and sections on railroads, poetry, and music. Not to forget children's books, too.

Every penny raised from the book sale is donated to the library, to be spent only for books and library materials, and is a significant part of the Friends and Foundation's annual gift of \$40,000 for the library's Book Fund. Thanks to our generous donors and volunteers, gently used books are given a second life in someone's personal library, and then a third life as new library book purchases to be enjoyed by library patrons.

The shop is on the grounds of St Mary's by-the-Sea Episcopal Church at 142 12th Street. If you haven't yet come in, do stop by; if you have come in, come again!
